Becoming a Writer-in-Residence:

First Story writers work with a selected group of students to inspire their love of writing and build their confidence.

Although we offer different levels of engagement for our school partners across the country the core elements of our residencies remain the same.

For each progamme we ask First Story writers-in-residence to:

- Plan and deliver workshops to a group of up to 21 students:
 - **Year-Long:** minimum **16** workshops of 90 minutes (residency runs throughout autumn & spring terms)
 - **Term-Long:** minimum **8** workshops of 90 minutes (residency runs in either the autumn or spring term)
 - **Week-Long: 8** workshops of 90 minutes across I week (residency available throughout the year)
- Collate and edit students' work for publication in a First Story anthology.
- Organise and host, with your school, the First Story anthology book launch.
- Deliver one teacher training session for up to 21 teachers at your school.
- Attend meetings of the First Story teachers and writers in your region.
- Attend a writers' Skills Sharing Day in London for First Story training and to share good practice.
- We also offer the opportunity for writers to lead workshops at Regional Events, our Young Writers' Festival and Summer Residential (for additional fees).

Remuneration:

• Year-long: a grant of £4,000

• **Term-long:** a grant of £2,400

• Week-Long: a grant of £1000

To Apply:

- A copy of your CV and a covering letter stating why you would like to be a First Story writer-in-residence.
- A sample of a secondary school workshop for a 90 minute session.
